#### Section 1

#### Purpose of this Emergency Plan

This Emergency Plan is jointly owned by the Ancaster and Wilsford Parish Councils who share responsibility for amending, updating and distributing the plan. Any questions or suggestions for amendments or inclusions should be addressed to the Clerk for the Parish Council.

In drawing up our joint emergency plan we adopted best practice from existing documents including the comprehensive Emergency Plan produced by Lincolnshire County Council (LCC) and a draft Emergency Plan written by Ancaster PC in September 2012 and also the Crisis/Recovery Plan issued by Mid-UK.

We received excellent guidance and co-operation from Lincolnshire County Council and Mid-UK Recycling. Our plan draws on human and material resources already available in the community. Even after the emergency services have taken charge, we will still need an efficient communications plan to enable information to be passed rapidly to the general public – particularly the elderly and the vulnerable - and to key stakeholders like schools, GPs surgeries and local businesses and traders. So, we have aimed to make the Joint Ancaster/Wilsford Emergency Plan a locally focused and community-based plan: THIS PLAN IS FOR YOU!

#### **RESPONSIBILITIES**

The prime responsibility for Emergency Planning and the updating of these instructions lies with the Core Planning Group (CPG) whose members are listed within this document. The CPG is also the contact point for Lincolnshire County Council, North and South Kesteven District Councils, the emergency services and first responders, schools, companies, Parish Councils and those providing services to the vulnerable.

This plan comes in two parts and has been developed to assist your community in an emergency.. Part 1, General Public information document, is meant as a quick reference guide of tasks that your Emergency Planning Group may wish to undertake in the event of emergency while Part 2 the Community Resource Directory has restricted access and contains the emergency contact details, known risks, resources, volunteers and places that have people who may need more support than others.

The Ancaster Facebook page will be used in times of emergency to carry information and messages from the CPG and, as importantly, also carry feed-back from you reporting on developments in your area e.g. the school with messages to parents on opening hours. Both websites will also carry upto-date information. Those with children at the school in Ancaster know of the system called Parent Mail though which all parents can receive an email message. The school also has a record of email and mobile phone numbers for all parents and many grandparents if these are needed.

GP practices also have means of contacting patients if, for example, the surgery had to close down and those with appointments needed to be advised of cancellation. In the case of an emergency, phone calls to the Ancaster surgery can be automatically transferred to the surgery in Caythorpe.

#### Activation

This Plan will be activated when at least two members of the Emergency Planning Group consider it necessary to take action in response to an incident

#### **Local Hazards & Threats**

Assessed in Risk for Ancaster & Wilsford

Pandemic Flu

Assessed Nationally and Regionally as our Highest Threat.

Inland Flooding

Flooding from the Beck (a tributary of the River Slea) is possible in the area. A more likely scenario is for surface water flooding to occur as a result of heavy prolonged rain fall- this is likely to increase in frequency due to the effects of global warming on our climate.

**Severe Weather** 

In recent times heavy rain, strong winds, snow and ice have become more frequent, possibly due to the effect of global warming. An effective Snow & Ice Clearance plan is required. Droughts should not be ruled out especially when we experience 2 consecutive winters of poor rain fall.

Transport Accidents

Serious vehicle accidents can lead to major disruption on roads through the area between Sleaford and Grantham which can limit access to the A1 Grantham and A15 /17 Sleaford. Other roads in the area that can lead to disruption are High Dyke and Ermine Street. There are a number of small RAF stations in the area which although risk is minimal, could result in significant disruption. Likewise there is a railway line passing through both communities.

**Industrial Accidents** 

Major fires at the nearby waste recycling plant have in the past caused disruption to both communities in the area. Smoke plumes (at best, an irritant, at worst, toxic) have caused the closure of schools and businesses. A major fire may result in significant detours being put in place disrupting residents and commuters.

Loss of Critical Infrastructure

Damage caused by fire, storms or accidents may have a potential impact on energy supplies, water or deprive the community of its important facilities including the school.


